

1.2 Personal Safety

DANGER

- + Before you start using the equipment, you should consult your physician that this type of exercise is suitable for you from a health perspective. 1.3 Set-Up Place



WARNING

- + Do not place the equipment in main corridors or escape routes.



CAUTION

- + Choose a location in which to place the equipment such that there is enough free space/ clearance to the front, the rear and to the sides of the equipment.
- + The training room should be well ventilated during training and not be exposed to any draughts.
- + Choose the place in which to set up the equipment such that there is enough free space/ clearance to the front, the rear and to the sides of the equipment.
- + The set-up and mounting surface of the equipment should be flat, loadable and solid.



ATTENTION

- + The device may only be used in one building, in sufficiently tempered and dry rooms (ambient temperatures between 10°C and 35°C). The equipment should not be used outdoors or in rooms with high humidity (over 70%) like swimming pools.
- + A floor protective mat/equipment underlay can help to protect high-quality floor coverings (parquet, laminate, cork, carpets) from dents and sweat and can help to level out slight unevenness.

2.1 General Instructions

⚠ DANGER

- + Do not leave any tools, packaging materials such as foils or small parts lying around, as otherwise there is a danger of suffocation for children. Keep children away from the equipment during assembly.





2.2 Scope of Delivery

2.3 Assembly


Before assembly, take a close look at the individual assembly steps shown and carry out the assembly in the order given.

① NOTICE

- + First loosely screw all parts together and check that they fit properly. Tighten the screws using the tool only when you are instructed to do so.
- + If you have difficulty recognising the graphics, we recommend that you open and/or download the PDF instructions stored in the webshop on your end device (e.g. smartphone, tablet or PC). There you have the option of zooming in closer. Please note that the Adobe Acrobat Reader programme must be installed on your end device in order to open the file.

Step 1: Assembly of Main Frame and Joint Frame


1. Assemble the joint frame (34-2) to the frame (001) by using four screws (027), four spring washers (033-1) and four flat washers (032).
2. Assemble the joint frame (34-2) to the main frame (33-2) by using four screws (76), four spring washers (75) and four plain washers (74).

Step 2: Assembly of Pedal Frame


Assemble the pedal frame (37-2) to the main swing span (36-2) and the front swing span (35-2) by using two axles (46) and four circlips (81).

Step 3: Assembly of Left and Right Handle Bracket

Assemble the left handle bracket (43) and the right handle bracket (44) to the main frame (33-2) by using two screws (90), four plain washers (77) and two lock nuts (79).



Step 4: Assembly of Backrest Adjusting Board and Backrest Support

1. Assemble the backrest adjusting board (42) to the backrest support (40) by using two screws (88), two spring washers (87) and two plain washers (86).
2. Assemble two screws (89), two plain washers (86) and two limiting rubbers (67) to the backrest adjusting board (42).
3. Assemble the backrest support (40) to the main frame (33-2) by using one axle (49) and two circlips (81).









Step 5: Assembly of the Pulleys and Cable Routing

① NOTICE


- + The majority of the pulleys are pre-assembled when delivered. These pulleys need to be disassembled in order to perform the cable routing.
 - + The two pulleys (012 and 013) for the frame are not pre-assembled
1. Route the cable (45) over the pulley set (013) and assemble the pulley set (013) to the upper side of the frame (001) and pulley baffle (004) with the pre-assembled screw (026), two flat washers (031) and one nut (034-1).
 2. Route the cable (45) down and under the pulley set (012) and assemble the pulley set (012) to the lower side of the frame (001) with the pre-assembled screw (025), two flat washers (031) and one nut (034-1).
 3. Disassemble pulley (63) in location A, route the cable (45) around and reassemble the pulley (63).
 4. Disassemble pulley (63) in location B, route the cable (45) around and reassemble the pulley (63).
 5. Disassemble pulley (63) in location C, route the cable (45) around and reassemble the pulley (63).
 6. Attach the lower cable end (45) to the knuckle bearing (53).





Step 6: Assembly of Backrest Cushion and Seat Pad

1. Assemble the backrest cushion (47) to the main frame (33-2) by using two screws (88), two spring washers (87) and two plain washers (86).
2. Assemble the seat pad (48) to the main frame (33-2) by using four screws (88), four spring washers (87) and four plain washers (86).



Step 7: Assembly of the Weight Stack Plates and Labels

① NOTICE

The guide rods are pre-assembled to the frame.

1. Disassemble the upper part of the guide rods (002) by removing the socket set (021), the guide rod fixing sleeves (003), the split washers (028) and the bumpers (014).
2. Slide the 14 weight stack plates (54) onto the guide rods (002).
3. Slide the weight stack plate (94) onto the guide rods (002).
4. Slide the cable set (45) into the weight stack plate (94).
5. Insert the selector pin (020) into any desired hole of the weight stack plates (54).
6. Slide the previously removed bumpers (014) back onto the guide rods (002).
7. Fix the guide rods (002) to the upper part of the frame (001) with the previously removed socket sets (021), guide rod fixing sleeves (003) and split washers (028).
8. Slide the cable set (45) into the weight stack plate (94).
9. Wipe the front surface of the weight stack.
10. Peel off the adhesive back sheet from the label and make sure the label remains attached to the application tape.
11. Align the center hole of the label with the weight stack center hole.
12. Line up the first label to the hole of the top plate.
13. Make sure the label is straight, then slowly press into place.
14. Gently remove the application tape and rub each label firmly against the weight stack.
15. Allow the labels to stand for at least 24 hours.



Step 8: Assembly of Side Shields and Trays

① NOTICE

The left and right shields are pre-assembled with a front or rear middle trim. Make sure to align the shields in the respective direction (front/rear).

1. Assemble the left and right shields (005 & 006) with the rear and front middle trim (008 & 009) to the frame (001) with four screws (022).
2. Assemble both side shields (007) to the frame (001) with four connecting strips (011) by using twelve screws (022).
3. Assemble the trays (010) to the frame (001) with two screws (024) and two flat washers (029).

3.1 General Instructions

⚠ WARNING

- + The storage location should be chosen so that improper use by third parties or children can be prevented.
- + If your equipment does not have transportation wheels, the equipment must be disassembled before transportation.

- + In addition to the instructions and recommendations for maintenance and care given here, additional service and/or repair work may be necessary; this must only be carried out by authorised service technicians.

4.2 Faults and Fault Diagnosis

The equipment undergoes regular quality controls during production. Nevertheless, faults or malfunctions may occur. Frequently, individual parts are responsible for these disturbances, an exchange is usually sufficient. Please refer to the following overview for the most common errors and how to correct them. If the equipment still does not function properly, contact your contract partner.

Fault	Cause	Solution
Grinding noises	Cables or pulleys do not run smoothly or are damaged	+ Visual inspection of the cable routing or the pulley guide + If damaged, replace the defective part
Weight hanging in the air	Cable tensioned too tight	Readjust cable tension
Cable without tension	Cable too loose	+ Check cable routing + Readjust cable tension
Squeaking & cracking noises	Screw connections loosened or too tight	+ Check or lubricate screw connections + Check cable routing
Unit wobbles	+ Uneven ground + Loose screw connections	+ Align unit + Tighten screw connections
Heavy draught	+ Weight holders/guide rods too dry + Faulty cable routing	+ Lubricate guide rods + Check cable routing

4.3 Maintenance and Inspection Calendar

To avoid damage from body sweat, the equipment must be cleaned with a damp towel (no solvents!) after each training session.







In addition to the statutory warranty, we provide a warranty for every fitness equipment purchased from us according to the following provisions.

Your statutory rights are not affected.

Warranty

The warranty is the first/original buyer and/or any person who received a newly purchased product as a gift from the original buyer.

Warranty period

The warranty periods, shown on our web shop, begin on delivery of the fitness equipment. The respective warranty periods for your equipment can be found on its product website.

Repair Costs

According to our choice, there will either be a repair, a replacement of individual damaged parts or a complete replacement. Spare parts, that have to be mounted while assembling the equipment, have to be replaced by the warranty personally and are not a part of repair. After the expiration of the warranty period for repair costs, a pure parts warranty applies, which does not include the repair, installation and delivery costs.

The terms of use are defined as follows:

- + Home use: solely for private use in private households up to 3 hours per day
- + Semi-professional use: up to 6 hours per day (e. g. rehabilitation centres, hotels, clubs, company gyms)
- + Professional use: more than 6 hours per day (e. g. commercial gyms)

Warranty Service

Within the warranty period, equipment which develops faults as a result of material or manufacturing defects, will be repaired or replaced at our discretion. Ownership of equipment or parts of equipment which have been replaced is transferred to us. The warranty period is not extended nor does a new warranty period begin following repair or replacement under the warranty.

Warranty Conditions

For the warranty to be valid, the following steps must be taken:

Please contact our customer service by email or phone. If the product under warranty has to be sent in for repair, the seller bears costs. After expiry of the warranty, the buyer bears the costs of transport and insurance. If the fault is covered by our warranty, you will receive a new or repaired equipment in return.

Warranty claims are invalid in case of damage resulting from:

- + misuse or improper handling
- + environmental influences (moisture, heat, electrical surge, dust, etc.)
- + failure to follow the current safety measures for the equipment
- + failure to follow the operating instructions
- + use of force (e. g. hitting, kicking, falling)
- + interventions which were not carried out by one of our authorized service centres
- + unauthorised repair attempts

Proof of Purchase and Serial Number

Please make sure that you are able to provide the appropriate receipt when claiming on your warranty. So that we can clearly identify the model of your equipment, and for the purposes of our quality control, you will need to give the serial number of your equipment, when contacting the service team. Where possible please have your serial number and your customer number ready when you call our service hotline. It will help us to deal with your request swiftly.

If you cannot find the serial number on your fitness equipment, our service team is at your disposal to offer further information.

Service outside of the Warranty Period

We are also happy to issue an individual cost estimate if there is a problem with your fitness equipment after the warranty has expired, or in cases which do not fall under the terms of the warranty, e. g. normal wear and tear. Please contact our customer service team to find a quick and cost-effective solution to your problem. In such a case you will be responsible for the delivery costs.

Communication

Many problems can be solved just by speaking to us as your specialist supplier. We know how important it is to you as a user of the fitness equipment to have problems solved quickly and simply, so you can enjoy working out with minimal interruption. For that reason, we also want to resolve your queries quickly and in a straightforward manner. Thus, please always keep your customer number and the serial number of the faulty equipment handy.




